Streambank Plantings:

Water-loving trees, shrubs and perennial plants prevent soil erosion and filter runoff.

Dry Laid Stone Wall & Water Garden:

Provide diverse habitat for wildlife & microclimates for plants.

Buffer Plantings:

Screen winter winds.

Trees and shrubs:

Trees and shrubs provide shade, reduce water runoff, and clean the air. Native species restore habitat & biodiversity.

Groundcovers:

Reduce lawn and are perfect for sloped and rarely utilized areas

Islands:

Add privacy and habitat, reducing high maintenance lawns
