## Headwaters Native Tree and Shrub Seedling Sale 2010

### - Seedling Descriptions -

American Plum - Prunus americanus  
To 30' tall. Multistemmed with spreading crown. Fruits 1" in diameter, good for wildlife. Upland.

Buttonbush – Cephalanthus occidentalis  
Shrubby, to 20'tall and round. Fragrant powderpuff flowers. Long glossy green leaves. Prefers wet areas. Lowland.

Crabapple(flowering) – Malus augustifolia  
To 30'. Pink flowers and small fruits, eaten by birds and other wildlife. Upland.

Cranberrybush viburnum –Viburnum opulus  
8-10', Bushy soft maple-like leaves, white lacecap flowers, and edible red tart red berries in fall. Attracts butterflies, birds. Moist soils. Tubeling. Lowland.

Dogwood (whiteflowering) – Cornus florida  
15-30'. VA state flower, with bright red berries following spring flowers, crimson fall foliage. Plant for good air drainage. Upland.

Fringetree – Chionanthus virginicus  
To 25', very fragrant flowers, blue berries in winter. Multi-stemmed. Upland.

Redbud –Cercis Canadensis  
To 25', spreading branches with pink flowers in April, heart shaped leaves. Upland.

Northern Red Oak – Quercus rubra  
To 80'. fast growing oak, leaves russet red in fall. Acorns 1" long. Upland.

#### Tree Tube Kit

Choose either a 2' or 4' plastic tube, weed excluding mat, four ground staples, and 2' or 4' oak stake.

Don't forget the flowers on pick up day:  
Ironweed and Cardinal Flower for lowlands,



Perennial sunflower for uplands.

Red Osier Dogwood – Cornus sericea  
Multi-stemmed shrub to 8' tall and round, white flowers in May, bright red stems are beautiful in winter. Prefers wet areas. Lowland.

River Birch – Betula nigra  
Multiple stemmed small tree with distinctive cinnamon-red peeling bark. Moist locations. Tiny cones from spring catkins. Lowland.

Sourwood - Oxydendrum arboreum  
To 60', but usually smaller, with broad crown. Flowers are sought by honeybees. Found at higher elevations, planted as ornamental. Upland.

Sugar maple - Acer saccharum  
To 90'. Long-lived tree, orange-red in fall. "Helicopter" Seeds are good wildlife food. Maple syrup is good people food. Upland.

Swamp white oak – Quercus bicolor  
To 80', irregular crown, 1" acorns. Excellent for squirrel and deer. The name is the tip: likes wet areas. Lowland.

White oak – Quercus alba  
To 100', wide-spreading crown, gray bark, purple-red foliage in fall, long-lived, produces sweet acorns, valuable lumber. Upland.

White Pine - Pinus strobus  
Fast-growing to 100', 5- needle pine for Christmas trees, windbreaks, timber. Adaptable. Upland.

Winterberry - Hamamelis virginiana  
Deciduous holly. 10' rounded habit with dark green leaves, shiny bright red fruit remains through winter. Tubeling. Lowland.

Upland Paradise Island Kit: 2 (r/w oak, maple) trees, 3 wh pine,3 redbud,3 dogwood, 1 crabapple, 1 Am plum, 2 fringetree,1 sourwood,13 tubes

Lowland Paradise Island Kit: 3 riverbirch trees,3 cranberrybush, 3 winterberry, 3 red osier dogwood, 3 buttonbush, 3 swamp white oak, 18 tubes
